The Department actively participated in the JJ Consultation for North Eastern Regions held by the Juvenile Justice Committee of the High Court.

In order to popularise the portal a number of initiatives like pamphlets, posters, audio visuals on role and responsibility of different stakeholders have been developed in partnership with NIC WB and supported by UNICEF.

Our endeavour to reunite children with their families continues to remain another priority issue in our efforts of restoration and reintegration. A number of children were restored and a leading role in this regard was played by the West Bengal Task Force. The State received special recognition for its works on trafficking and repatriation through the Skoch award.

MESSAGE

Child Protection issues are slowly gaining visibility now. Most of the staff in SCPS and DCPUs have joined or are in the process of joining. We need to work together as a team to address the issues of child protection. One of the focal points of ICPS is capacity building, as a cadre of trained professionals is essential to achieve targets and realization of goals. The new and existing team members need to be trained on the child protection issues on a priority basis. Plans are also afoot for developing of uniform training modules for ICPS functionaries.

Child Protection Committees (CPC's) are being formed at the block, ward and the village level. It is envisaged that these will act as community level safety nets for all child protection issues. Capacity building in this regard has been initiated through designated State Level pool of Resource Persons along with identified Master Trainers at the District level. Training Manuals have also been developed for them.

Efforts have been made to streamline adoption through capacity building at all levels including District Judges. This has yielded positive results has come down significantly. The pendency of adoption cases before the courts. efforts have been made to improve the quality of Child Study Report (CSR) and Medical Examination Report (MER) two documents critical for adoption, Capacity building of the Principal Magistrate of JJB and the Addl. District Judges was also carried out on JJ Act and POSCO respectively.

Trafficking has emerged as a burning issue. West Bengal Task force has proactively taken up the issue and has developed an action plan through a consultative process which will be implemented soon. An interstate level consultation was also held to address this issue. Repatriation of children from Bangladesh is being carried out on a priority basis. Similarly, restoration of children of other states has also been taken up. We have our take cut out and hope that this dedicated team of well-equipped professionals will make untiring in the field of child protection.

In the end I would like to acknowledge the unstinting support and guidance of our Chairperson and Executive Chairperson, I would also like to thank all the officials and SCPS functionaries for their untiring work and also in putting the Annual Report together.

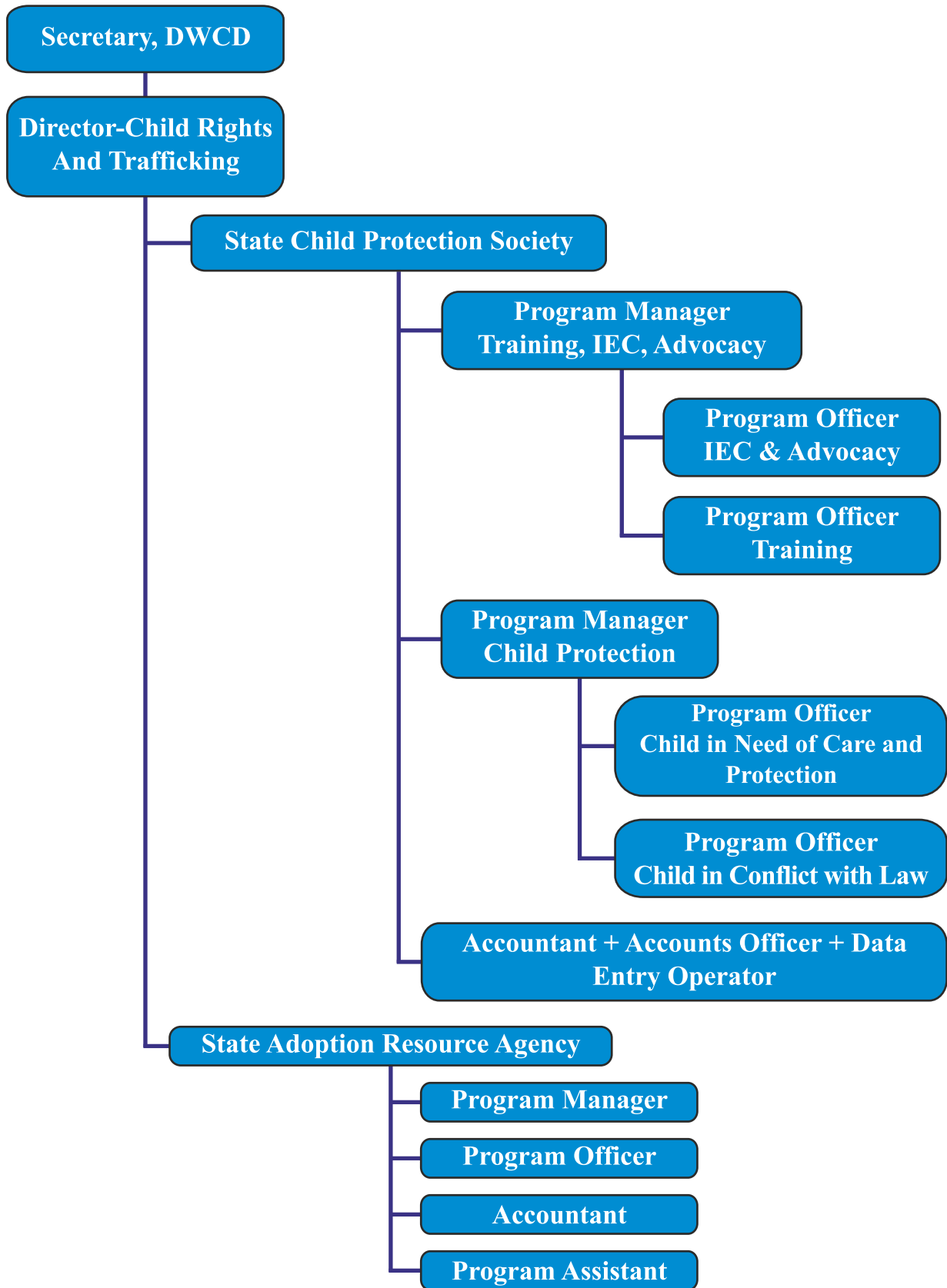

Capacity Building

Capacity building of ICPS functionalities and service providers is one of the guiding principles of ICPS. In order to enhance skills and enrich knowledge in child protection of ICPS functionalities, a number of capacity building programmes was organized by SCPS throughout the year.

- Two hands-on training sessions on Track CHILD 2.0 were organized for DCPOs, Data Entry Operators and CCI functionalities on 02.04.15 and 17.04.15 at ATI. 125 participants were trained in the web based Child Protection Management Information System and data management through these trainings.
- Two day orientation training on ICPS of newly formed CWCs of seven districts in and around Kolkata was held at ICMARD on 28th - 29th May, 2015. Another two day training programme for CWCs and SAAs of six (6) North Bengal districts was held in Jalpaiguri on 29th – 30th June, 2015.

CWC Training

- Training on New Adoption Guideline was organized by SARA, WB, on 5th and 6th October, 2015. On 5th October, 2015, a Workshop with DSWOs, DCPOs and SAAs was organized at the Conference Hall of Netaji Subhash Open University. Resource Persons from CARA were present in the Workshop. On 6th October, 2015, the Social Workers of SAAs attended a hands-on training session on revamped CARINGS at ATI, Salt Lake.
- A two day Workshop for CWCs of five districts of South Bengal was organized by SCPS on 13th - 14th October, 2015 at ICMARD in collaboration with TDH Foundation and Jayprakash Institute of Social Change. Chairpersons and members of the newly constituted CWCs were oriented on JJ Act. Dr. Shashi Panja, HMOS was present in the programme and she addressed the participants on their roles and responsibilities.





- On 04.12.15, training of co-ordinator and Social Worker of a newly functional SAA, Domkal Bikash Kendra, Murshidabad, was organized by SARA at ICMARD building.
- A two day workshop for State Level Resource Persons (SLRPs) was organized by SCPS, West Bengal on 16th-17th February, 2016 at Hotel Stadel, Salt Lake, in collaboration with Save the Children and Unicef. 29 SLRPs selected from senior government officers, NGO representatives and Consultants took part in the Workshop. Mock sessions were organized following the induction Training Manual for CPCs. Through this workshop, the SLRPs were equipped to conduct training of trainers (TOT) of CPCs.

- The Induction Training of MTs was held on 22nd Feb -24th Feb 2016 at ICMARD building, Conference room of WBCPCR. It was organized by SCPS, West Bengal in collaboration with UNICEF & Save the Children. 28 MTs of Howrah Dist. and South 24 Pgs. participated in the training. The training was inaugurated by Smt. Richa Misra, Director, Child Rights & Trafficking (DCRT), Liakat Ali, Jt Director, DCRT, Sri Indu Sekhar Chatterjee, DD, DCRT, Sri Supriya Sarkar, AD, DCRT and Sri Nihar Ranjan Samanta, AD, DCRT. The three day training programme was based in the Induction Training Manual developed by SCPS in collaboration with UNICEF. Participatory methodologies were used and pre and post training assessment was done in the programme.

- A training of functionaries of 27 Open Shelters was organized from 14th-16th march, 2016 at ICMARD building by Controller of Vagrancy in collaboration with SCPS. The staff members of Open Shelters were oriented on the new JJ Act and also on the roles and responsibilities of functionaries of Open Shelters. Controller of Vagrancy, Deputy Director and Assistant Director of DCRT and Chief Organizer, CV, were the Resource Persons.
- On March 21st, hands-on training on Track CHILD 2.0 of 69 CWPOs of different Police Stations of Kolkata was organized at ATI by DWCD. The Track CHILD 2.0 kit developed in collaboration with UNICEF and NIC containing brochure, CD and IEC materials on the portal was released by Ms. Roshni Sen, Secretary, Mr. Debasish Boral, Jt. CP (Crime), Kolkata Police and Ms. Paramita Neogi, CP Specialist, UNICEF on the same day.
- On 21st and 22nd March, 2016, Assistant cum Data Entry Operators of DCPUs of Paschim and Purba Medinipur, Bankura, Birbhum and Purulia were given hands on training on Track CHILD 2.0 at Midnapore. Resource Persons were drawn from NIC and UNICEF consultants. The participants were presented with Track CHILD 2.0 kits.
- On March 30th, 2016, a discussion on Foster care was organized by DWCD at the Conference Hall, Bikash Bhawan. The Programme was attended by the Director, Child Rights and Trafficking and senior officials of the Directorate of Child Rights and Trafficking, Deputy Secretary, DWCD, representatives of UNICEF, TDH, staff of SARA and SCPS participated in the programme.



Interface with Judiciary

Regional Consultation on strengthening, restoration, repatriation and rehabilitation of children was organized by High Court, Calcutta, in collaboration with DWCD & SW, West Bengal Judicial Academy and UNICEF. The said consultation was held in High Court Sesquicentennial Hall from 12th -13th September, 2015 and participants from seven North Eastern States, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and West Bengal took part in it. Hon'ble Justice Madan B. Lokur, Chairman, Supreme Court Committee on monitoring of JJAct, presided over the programme.

NON - INSTITUTIONAL CARE

ADOPTION

“State Adoption Resource Agency” means the agency set up by the State Government under the Integrated Child Protection Scheme. SARA (State Adoption Resource Agency) is a unit of SCPS (State Child Protection Society) in West Bengal. SARA is functioning as the State level Resource Centre in coordinating, monitoring and developing the adoption program in the State and to facilitate the set-up of SAAs. SARA promotes in-country and regulates inter-country adoptions in coordination with CARA. SARA supervises the work of SAAs/RIPAs and ensures coordination between them within the State.

In last one year different programs and activities were conducted by the State Adoption Resource Agency, West Bengal to develop the adoption program in the State. The programs were on awareness generation, sensitization for Specialized Adoption Agency, District Child Protection Units and other stakeholders. This year priority was given on the legal perspective to expedite the delay in courts for the final adoption. Sensitization Workshop on adoption was conducted for the learned District Judges of West Bengal on 13.03.2016. It was an interactive program attended by the learned Judge and faculty from Judicial Academy West Bengal. The training program and hand holding support for newly notified SAAs and the District Child Protection Units were conducted throughout the year. The volume of awareness in the state is resembled by the number of queries that the SARA unit received every day from Prospective Adoptive Parents (PAP).

On April 10th, 2015 Meeting with District Child Protection Unit, Kolkata and Specialized Adoption Agencies of Kolkata was held at SARA's Office situated at ICMARD Building, Ultadanga. The meeting was conducted with an objective to streamline adoption status in Kolkata and to identify issues that need immediate attention for proper functioning of adoption in the District.

A review meeting with the entire Adoption Agencies of West Bengal was held on 25.05.15 at the Conference Hall of Bikash Bhavan. Pertinent issues i.e. the pending court cases in district court, legally free for adoption pending at Child Welfare Committee, publication process and the need for advocacy with the Missing Person Bureau for smooth functioning process of publication. were discussed. A way forward was shared and a timeline was set up to complete the said issues.

Recruitment of Social Workers has been done to expedite conduction of pending Home Study Report (HSR) in various adoption agencies.

A Meeting was held to sensitise the Social Workers of different adoption agencies about preparation of Child Study Report, Medical Examination Report and Home Study Report. Initiatives have been taken to identify adoptable Children in CCIs for placing them in adoption through SAA - CCI linkage.



Two Days Training on New Adoption Guideline was organized by SARA, W.B, on 5th and 6th October, 2015 with an objective to provide adequate knowledge, skill and motivation to all stakeholders of the adoption programme about the policy and procedure of adoption and related matters as provided under New Adoption Guidelines 2015.

On day one focus was on the theoretical aspect on the adoption guidelines which was imparted by CARA Officials and SARA Officials and on the second day the focus was in the hands on training and revamped CARINGS i.e. Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System, which is a web based online platform building bridges and creating links through a robust web based management system designed to

The participants of the Workshop were District Social Welfare Officers, District Child Protection Officers and Specialized Adoption Agencies. SPONSORSHIP

Sponsorship as per revised ICPS is the provision of supplementary support to families for

- Preventing child destitution, abuse, exploitation and it offers holistic child protection including counselling and guidance.
- Providing conditional assistance to ensure that the child continues his/her education.
- Offering child care within the family/ extended family environment.
- Preserving families and encouraging parents to fulfil their responsibilities towards the growth and development of their children.

Types of Sponsorship.

- REHABILITATIVE-Children placed into institutions by families as a poverty coping measure to reunite them with their families.
- PREVENTIVE–Support to families living in extreme conditions of deprivation or exploitation to enable the child to remain in his/her family.

Foster Care

Foster Care is an arrangement whereby a child lives, usually on a temporary basis, with unrelated family members. The child is placed in the family that has been selected, qualified, approved and supervised by the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) for providing such care.

The Model Guidelines on Foster care notified by Ministry of Women and Child Development was circulated to all districts. A meeting with the Sponsorship and Approval Committees (SFCAC) of Howrah, Hooghly, Kolkata, North 24 Parganas, Paschim Medinipur, Purba Medinipur and South 24 Parganas was held on 19.02.16 at the Conference Hall, 10th floor, Bikash Bhawan. Ms. Richa Misra, Director, Child Rights and Trafficking, chaired the meeting. Other senior officers of the Directorate were present.





Child Protection Committees

A Child Protection Committee (CPC) is a community based group including duty-bearers who are primarily responsible for creating and promoting a child-friendly and safe community environment wherein all children's well-being, safety and rights are protected. The roles and responsibilities of CPCs include monitoring, reporting and responding to issues of child protection in the community, planning and taking up innovative activities for raising awareness on child protection in the community. CPCs are also responsible for developing Annual Action Plan to address CP issues, referring and reporting cases to higher level CPCs and DCPU and engaging stakeholders in raising awareness.

The ICPS scheme mentions formation of Block/ward and village level CPCs. (point 6.5 and point 6.6 page 73, revised ICPS). The need for restructuring the existing VCPCs as per ICPS was felt. Accordingly, a consultative process was initiated by SCPS, West Bengal in June 2013. UNICEF and Save the Children facilitated the process of framing guidelines for constituting CPCs and leading NGOs like CINI, JPISC, Prajaak, Jabala and others actively participated in it.

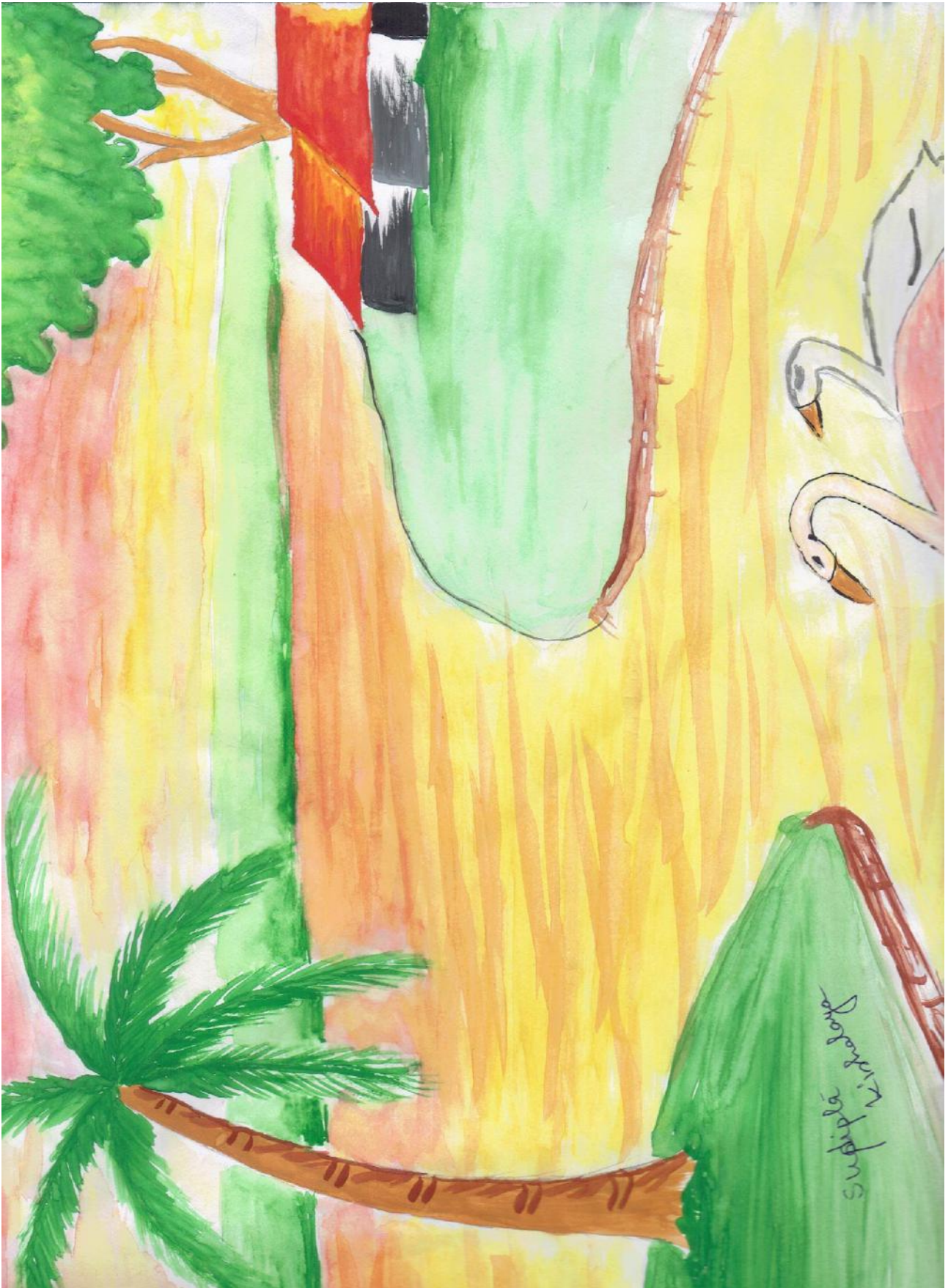
The Guidelines for the formation and strengthening of CPCs was launched by the Department of Child Development, Women Development and Social Welfare, West Bengal on 17.07.14.

Important Meetings

- The National Consultation on Juvenile Justice monitoring Committees was held in New Delhi on 25th April, 2015. Director of Child Rights and Trafficking, Mrs. Richa Misra and Assistant Director, DSW, Mr. Indu Sekhar Chatterjee attended it. A compliance report on the long and short term goals set after the Regional Consultation at Cuttack in September, 2014 was updated for the said consultation.
- The Executive Committee Meeting of SCPS was held at Conference Hall of Bikash Bhavan on 12.05.15. The meeting was chaired by Ms. Roshni Sen, Secretary, DWCD & SW and Executive Chairperson of SCPS. Senior government officers of DWCD and other line departments, representatives of prominent NGOs who are members of Executive Committee, attended the meeting. The proposals approved by Project Sanctioning Committee for FY 2015-16 were placed before this committee for further approval. The Committee took a decision in this regard.
- A review meeting of Adoption Agencies was held on 25.05.15 at Conference Hall, Bikash Bhavan
- Meeting of the subcommittee on Registration under Juvenile Justice Act was held at Bikash Bhavan on 10.06.15.
- The Annual General Meeting of SCPS was held on 19.06.15 at Conference Hall, Bikash Bhavan. It was chaired by Dr. Shashi Panja, HMOS(IC) and Chairperson of SCPS. The decision taken by the Executive Committee was ratified in this meeting. The logo of SCPS was formally launched in this occasion.
- A meeting with the Eastern Regional office Head and senior officers of CHILDLINE India Foundation, Eastern Regional Resource Centre, was held on 16.07.15 at Conference Hall, Bikash Bhawan. Secretary, DWCD and Director, CRT were present in the meeting and the progress and problems of the 24X7 emergency outreach services run by CHILDLINE were discussed in this meeting.
- A meeting on Social Audit under ICPS was organized at the office of Director, CRT on 03.07.15. Prominent NGO functionaries participated in the meeting.
- On December 9th & 10th, 2015, review meeting on status of formation of CPCs was held with DCPUs and nodal NGOs at Conference Hall, Bikash Bhawan. A time line was set for the districts for completing the formation of CPCs at Block, Ward and Gram Samsad level by end of March, 2016.
- The Meeting of Project Sanction Committee for FY 2016-17 was held on 18.02.2016 at the Conference Hall of the Department. Smt. Roshni Sen, Secretary, chaired the meeting. Sri N.G. Hira, Commissioner, Smt Richa Misra, Director, CRT, Sri Biswanath Chakrabarty, Controller of Vagrancy, The Commissioner, Disability Commission,



Officers of the Directorate of CRT, SCPS/SARA/UNICEF Officials remained present in the meeting. A threadbare discussion was made on the functioning of the existing projects, proposals of new projects and financial aspect of the projects.

- A meeting with the Sponsorship and Approval Committees (SFCAC) of Howrah, Hooghly, Kolkata, North 24 Parganas, Paschim Medinipur, Purba Medinipur and South 24 Parganas was held on 19.02.16 at the Conference Hall, 10th floor, Bikash Bhawan. Ms. Richa Misra, Director, Child Rights and Trafficking, chaired the meeting. Other senior officers of the Directorate were present. 42 members participated in the meeting in which the salient features of the Model Guidelines on Foster Care were discussed. The queries of the participants regarding Foster care were also answered.
- In order to regulate the process of repatriation and also to avoid inordinate delays, a meeting with the Directorate, Home authorities and the various NGOs facilitating repatriation from the Homes was held on 19.02.16 at Bikash Bhawan.



Repatriation, Restoration and Anti-Trafficking Initiatives

- **State level Meetings on Trafficking Issues : 3** (Three) meetings of West Bengal Task Force were held during this period with participation from all the members. The Task Force was reconstituted in January 2016 with the membership from National Informatics Centre and Commissioner from the Dept. of Child Development, Women Development and Social Welfare. The meetings were chaired by Secretary to the Dept. of CD, WD & SW.

A NGO meeting was conducted in February 2016 to expedite the repatriation process along with the home superintendents of two Govt. run homes where maximum number of Bangladeshi Nationals are lodged.

The 2nd meeting of State Advisory Committee on Combating Commercial Sexual Exploitation was held in October 2015. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Sashi Panja, Hon'ble MOS (IC), DWCD & SW and the Chairperson of the committee.

Video Conference with Maharashtra Task Force was held in February 2016 to streamline the restoration process.



- **Interstate Convergence Workshop on Anti Trafficking :**

An Interstate workshop on Anti Trafficking was organised by Department of Child Development, Women Development and & Social Welfare, Govt of West Bengal in collaboration with Save the Children and Jayaprakash Institute of Social Change on 2nd and 3rd Feb, 2016 in Kolkata. The main objective of the workshop was to explore the possibilities of interstate collaboration and coordination and sensitize key stakeholders on the dimensions of human trafficking including its recent trends, investigation techniques, rescue and post rescue protocols.



Dr. Sashi Panja, Hon'ble MOS (IC), DWCD & SW along with other representatives from the Department, Anti Human Trafficking units, members of Child Welfare Committees, and NGOs engaged in rescue and post rescue work of human trafficking from the States of West Bengal, Jharkhand, Delhi and Maharashtra were part of the workshop. The workshop witnessed overwhelming participation from around 90 guests having experience of working on the issue of human trafficking.



○ **SKOCH Smart Governance Award :**

Dept. of CD, WD & SW received the SKOCH Smart Governance award in September 2015 for its contribution in Prevention of Trafficking related activities in the state of West Bengal.



○ **Repatriation of Bangladeshi Nationals :** 109 Bangladeshi nationals were repatriated between April 2015 to March 2016. The month wise break up for repatriation is as follows :

OPEN SHELTERS

There are **26 Open Shelters** spread over Kolkata, North 24 Parganas, South 24 Parganas, Howrah, Jalpaiguri and Darjeeling. (Details provided in Annexure).

A **Capacity Building programme** of staff of Open Shelter was organized at ICMRD Conference Hall from 14-16th March 2016. Around 200 participants comprising of Coordinators, Social Workers, Caregivers and Outreach Workers of Open Shelter took part in the programme. DCPU officials of different districts and NGO officials running Open Shelters also participated in the programme. The programme was organized by Controller of Vagrancy and resource persons included officials from the Directorate of Child Rights and Trafficking, Vagrancy Directorate and professionals.

Street Children Sports meet with the children of Open Shelters and Units under Eradication & Control of Juvenile Beggary and Vagrancy Scheme, at Bidhannagar Municipal Sports Complex was organized by the Controller of Vagrancy, under Women & Child Development and Social Welfare on 23rd December 2015. The programme was inaugurated by the Hon'ble MOS, (IC) Dr Shashi Panja, Department of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare. Eminent sports personality, Shri Nema Goswami, was present as the Chief Guest of the gala event. All the Departmental officials and also many eminent sports personalities were present in the meet. More than 600 children from 24 Open Shelters under ICPS & 6 Units under Eradication & Control of Juvenile Beggary and Vagrancy participated in the Sports meet. The children enjoyed the meet and participated with full energy. They took part in many events like different run, long jump, skipping, sack race, hitting the wicket, spoon-marble balance race, go-as-you-like etc Medals and Trophies were awarded to the successful participants. Participants were also given certificates and consolation prizes. Department of CD, WD and SW arranged sports uniform for all 600 children who took part in the meet.

Status regarding Implementation of Child Protection Programs with support from UNICEF:

The District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Purulia in collaboration with support from the District Administration and UNICEF has implemented the following activities w.e.f. Jan, 2015:

- Prepared Project Implementation Plan (PIP) for 2015-16;
- District level sensitization program on child protection issues;
- Formation of Block Level Child Protection Committees (BLCPCs) and Village/ Ward Level Child Protection Committees (V/WLCPCs);
- Sensitization of BLCPCs;
- Training of BWOs on Child Protection issues;
- Orientation of the Master Trainers at the district level for formation of CPCs;

Key Activities :

1. **District level sensitization program:** It was organized on 7.2.2015 at Conference hall of Zilla Parishad, Purulia primarily to disseminate information to the BDOs and Office bearers of Panchayet Samiti about the major child protection issues in the state and the district and discuss about the need for formation of child protection committees within a stipulated time frame. In the District level sensitisation programme, BDOs were given copies of the State Guidelines of CPC formation and presentations were made on roles and responsibilities of the CPCs at the Block and Village level.

It was decided that such sensitization programmes would be organised in each Block before the BLCPCs are formed. It was also decided that the formation of BLCPCs (20



Blocks) would be completed by June-July, 2015 on a step by step process. The sensitization programme was aimed at increasing the level of understanding on ICPS and its rolling out in the District.

 - B) **After Care Organisation Selection Committee & After Care Approval Committee :** As per Notification by the Secretary to the Govt. of West Bengal, Deptt. of WCD&SW the said Committee have been formed in the District Level.
 - C) **Block Level Child Protection Committee :** All the Block Level Child Protection Committee (22 Nos.) have been formed.
 - D) **Village Level Child Protection Committee :** 1901 Nos. VLCPCs have been formed out of 2504 Sansad.
 - E) **Ward Level Child Protection Committee :** 34 Nos. WLCPCs have been formed out of 58 ward.
- **Rescue of Children in need of Care & Protection :** Children are being rescued with the help of Childline & GRPF and being kept at Children's Home. Necessary action also being taken for proper restoration of those Children.
- **Restoration :** 115 nos. of Children has been restored to their family by the order of Child Welfare Committee from Shelter Home for MR Boys maintained by Netaji Youth Club & Pathagar and Sumangalam, Home for Boys.
- **Adoption :** 4 nos. of Children have been handed over to the adopted parents from SAA maintained by Chamtragora Adibasi Mahila Samity through Adoption Committee.

Inter Country Adoption of one child is under process.

- **Sponsorship Programme :** 2 nos. of Children have been covered under Sponsorship Programme.
- **Prevention of Child Marriage :** 45 Nos. of Cases of Child Marriage have been intervened by the Officials of DCPU as a result of which 45 Nos. of Marriages have been prevented with the help of local administration.
- **Steps against Sexual Abuse :** Information of 12 numbers of cases of Child Abuse were received. Among them 12 Children were counseled.
- **Implementation of POCSO Act, 2012 :** POCSO Act, 2012 is being implemented against the specific crime regarding sexual abuse to the child. There are 10 numbers of such cases in different Blocks recorded in district.



- **Registration of CCIs under JJ Act :** Necessary activity is being done to be registered all the CCIs under JJ Act. Already 1 no. of CCI has been registered under this Act. Applications of 14 nos. of CCIs has been received which are under process.
- **Convergence :** Convergence with the other line department is being developed. Convergence with Police Dept. has been made strongly. Police Administration is inviting the officials of DCPU on celebration of Special Day like International Women's Day and in there monthly Crime Meeting. Information from Education Deptt. & Backward Class Welfare Deptt. are being collected as a result of strong convergence.



Purba Medinipur

A) Felicitated the successful candidates of Madhyamik & Higher Secondary Examination selected from different Homes (CCIs) in the District on the occasion of Observation and Celebration of Child Protection Day:-

a. A Centralised programme was organised by the DCPS in the Conference Hall of the District Magistrate, Purba Medinipur regarding celebration of the day on 06.06.2015 at 8 AM. It was comprise of the following programme :-

- ❖ Speech on the programme by the Hon'ble guest.
- ❖ Performed Cultural Programme by inmates of Homes.
- ❖ Felicitation was given to 46 nos of Madhyamik and Higher Secondary passed inmates for the year 2015 from different homes in the district.



b. Programme organized in different homes in the district :-

As per instruction from SCPS, West Bengal vide reference no 599/WBCPCR/15 dated 22.05.2015, DCPS, Purba Medinipur celebrated the Child Protection Day on 6th and 7th June, 2015 in all homes (under JJ Act and Cottage) and other places under the Blocks in the district adopting the following theme :-

A meaningful theme of “Promote Healthy and Hygienic Life Style to the Children and protect them from diseases”. It comprised of the following types of works :-

- ❖ Providing separate individual set of towel, soap, shampoo, paste, brush, shoe, net & clean dress etc. (hygiene materials) for the children.
- ❖ Arrangement an open discussion with children and their parents about necessity of proper healthy and hygienic good habit such as tooth brushing (twice daily), bathing, use of separate soap, towel, sleep under mosquito net, early to bed and early to rise, physical exercise (Yoga), extra-curricular activities (drawing, recitation, song, drama etc.), proper hand wash with soap before



taking food and after lavation, prohibit fast-food and promote homemade nutritious food etc.

- ❖ Arrangement of colourful programme performed by the children in spirit of celebration of “Child Protection Day”.
- ❖ Arrangement of campaign on child rights and child protection issues in the respective local community.

c. Block level and others :-

- ❖ The fund for the said programme organized by the concerned BDO from the fund of the programme of Social Evils corresponded this office memo no 108/XIX/SW dated 02/03/2015.

d. Mass awareness by Street Theatre on Child related issues :- In this occasion Near about 3000 thousand participants watched this drama.



B) Observation of “Aaj Amar Janma Din” :- An innovative programme named “Aaj Amar Janmadin” (Birthday celebration of the inmates) is continuing in our district for the year 2015-2016 for development of self confidence of the inmates as well as promote Hygiene Practices for welfare of the inmates of the Homes. This year all CCIs were observed this occasion as per monthly birth calendar in their respective home premises.

C) Legal steps were taken in respect of CCI (Cottage Home) named Ramkrishna Ashram Khanjanchak, Haldia, Purba Medinipur for continuous torture upon the inmates by the Superintendent / Secretary.

An unfortunate incident of physical torturing and misbehaviour of the secretary of Ramkrishna Mission Ashram Khanjanchak on the inmate children came to the light on 06.02.2016 .After receiving the said information DCPU, Purba Medinipur interfered and a FIR was lodged at Durgachak Police Station Case no 19/2016 dated 06.02.2016 U/S-323/325/406/34 IPC and 75 of JJ Act 2015.The secretary and his associate were arrested on 06.02.2016. All the 24 children were shifted to the nearby cottage home run by Haldia Samajkalyan Parshad. The home was temporarily sealed by police.



D) Meeting with CCI (Child Care Institution) :

DCPU, Purba Medinipur is organizing meeting with all CCI (Child Care Institution) authorities on monthly basis. In this year 10 no of meeting organized by DCPU, Purba Medinipur. Several decision were taken for the welfare of inmates. Some major decisions which took in this year and implemented are as follows :

- i. Physical Verification of Members of the “NGO Management Committee”.**
- ii. Internal Audit in CCIs by DCPU:- Vocational training.**
- iii. Step taken against Un-authorized CCIs.**
- iv. Step taken for shifting the above 18 years inmates from CCIs.**
- v. Arrangement taken for transfer CNCP normal Children from mentally challenge Home (Registered under J.J. Act) to normal CNCP Home (Registered under J.J. Act) Ensure to take permission from statutory authority by all CCIs during out station programme including tour with inmates for proper safety of them.**

Howrah

- Situational analysis and need assessment on child right and protection issues of Howrah District was conducted for the financial year 2015-2016 by reviewing information from secondary sources for e.g. various department of the district and NGOs and some primary information collected from Child Care Institutions, Child Welfare Committee (CWC) & Juvenile Justice Board (JJB).
- Project Implementation Plan (PIP) along with budget to Howrah district for Integrated Child Protection Scheme was prepared by the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Howrah followed by receiving of proposals and budget of various Child Care Institutions and NGOs.
- **Capacity Building / Awareness & Advocacy Programme :** There were 32 (Thirty-two) number training, capacity building, awareness and advocacy programmes were imparted from the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Howrah in collaboration with following NGOs, namely Nari-O-Shisu Kalyan Kendra, Chiranabin, Green World, Dhulogori Mahila Samity and Agradut Pally Unnayan Samity. Beside this, DCPU provided technical support and resource person in various awareness programmes (15 numbers) including awareness programme on social evil in District level, Panchayat Samiti and Gram Panchayat level in the Howrah district, which were organized by Social Welfare Section, Howrah and District Project Management Unit (DPMU) for Kanyashree Prakalpa in collaboration with Block Development Offices of Howrah District.
- DCPU organized exhibition and arranged ventricular show in Kanyashree Divas, which too place on 14th August at Sarat Sadan, Howrah for awareness and advocacy generation towards child rights and protection, which was including child marriage, child labour and child trafficking. Caps distributed to children from DCPU in the occasion of Kanyashree Divas.
- DCPU in collaboration with Social Welfare Section, ICDS and DPMU for Kanyashree Prakalpa setup stall in Howrah district Book Fair-2015 at Sarat Sadan and exhibited Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials for awareness building on Child Right and Protection Officials from DCPU deputed rotation wise in stall for interacting with visitors in book fair.
- **Celebration of various programmes in district level :**
 - DCPS organized and celebrated Children's Day in Howrah District in the camps of Chiranabin in collaboration with District Legal Service Authority (DLSA) and Chiranabin Day on 14 November. All Child Care Institutions (CCIs) under J.J. Act were invited in the occasion. Officials of DLSA including Secretary, Members of Child Welfare Committee (CWC) including Chairperson and Officials of DCPU including Member Secretary attended the programme. Children of the Chironabin and ICDS Children Home participated in 'Provat Feri', 'Yoga Competition', 'Drawing Competition' and 'Sports'. Children also performed dance, songs and other cultural programme on stage. Prizes were distributed to the children, those who won the competition.

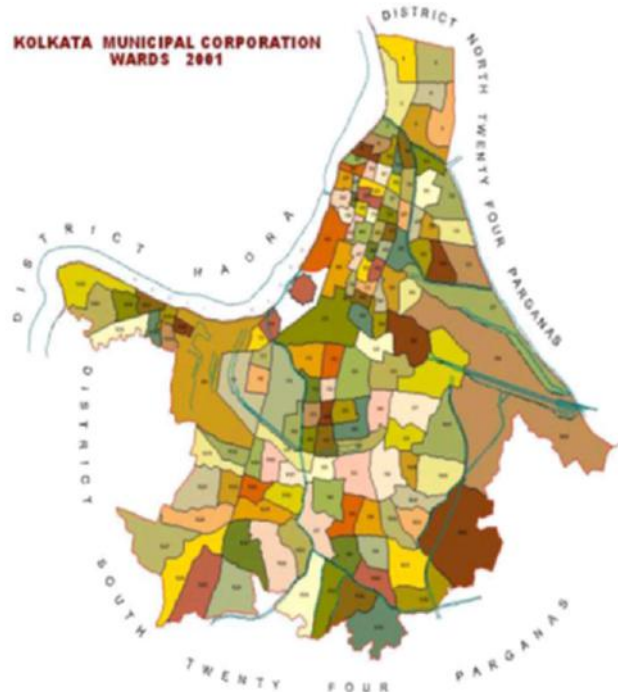

Kolkata

DISTRICT CHILD PROTECTION UNIT KOLKATA



Creating A Resource Directory : A resource Directory has been prepared by mapping all Child related service providers for the district of Kolkata. This directory contains almost 50 CCIs, 8 Cottage Homes ,12 Mass Education Homes , 16 residential schools under Sarba Shiksha Mission. The Directory also contains other important child related services i.e child line, ICDS centres, Hospitals, NGOs working in the field of child protection in collaboration



with DCPU Kolkata. The Directory ensures other allied systems including local bodies, concerned Govt. Departments, Judiciary, police stations etc. to reach out to children.

The resource Directory contains 19 running open shelter .Out of Which 4 for girls and 15 for Boys.

Reallocation of Children from Missionaries of Charity : 11 children were relocated to 5 SAA homes of Kolkata and Howrah. Out of 12 children 6 were relocated among ISSA, ISRC, SICW and 5 children were relocated in KARUNA and KEUTIA of Howrah District . During allocation representatives from DCPU Kolkata , Howrah and SARA were present to facilitate the whole processes. The whole process was coordinated by DCPU Kolkata. One child is remaining for adoption.

Setting up Child Protection Committees for effective implementation of programmes : Out of 144 wards WLCPC is formed in 105 Wards of Kolkata. Total 250 handout on Formation of Child Protection Committee was distributed among ward councillors, and responsible Govt stakeholders i.e- Labour Commission, Health and Family Welfare Department and education Department. In some of the committees the issues and challenges were discussed. The major challenges in Kolkata are child marriage, child labour and vulnerability among street children, drug addiction. All Bengal Women's Union is the nodal agency and CINI, World Vission, Jabala, DAS, Right Track. Indrajit Ray Foundation , City Level Plan of Action.

Celebration of Child Protection Day at CINI by DCPU Kokata : On 5th June 2015 DCPU kolkalta observed Child protection Day at CINI Pottery Road. 35 children participated on cultural programme and Drawing competition. A signature campaign was organized and 12 children were falicitated with wrist watch for appearing in Madhyamik examination. Children were given prizes those who ranked in cultural programme and drawing competition.





24 Parganas (North)

- **Capacity Building Program :** We have arranged several capacities Building program for, NGO, Stakeholders, Police Personnel, Para legal volunteer.
- **Awareness and advocacy :** During the year more than 102 awareness programs at school level, community level and Panchayat level have been conducted with collaboration of local NGOs and other stakeholders. In these programmes, issues like child marriage and trafficking have been raised very sensitively. We also aware the people about various govt. services which are of their help. Say child line 1098, about RTE act. about adoption process. etc
- **Child Marriages :** The district has vast border area and population. Still children in villages and slum/pavement area got married in a tender age causing severe health hazardous situations and depriving of rights. Our team has successfully stopped about 67 child marriages with support of Police, Panchayat member and local people. This is because of prompt action taken by our team members.
- **Restoration and Repatriation :** During the year a total of 54 children have restored and De-Institutionalized. At the same period about 9 children have been repatriated to Bangladesh.
- The DCPS, North 24 Parganas has worked a lot in **convergence and co-ordination** with civil society partners , Police, District Legal Service Agency(DLSA), Zilla Parishad and PRIs to spread the issues of child protection and child rights in all the category of community members in order to ensure a hassle free and child friendly environments.
- **Best Practices :**

Beside many good works done by us, we would like to mention one which touched the hearts of all of us.

Baby Diya Das aged about 10 months was sleeping in the lap of her mother. Her mother Doli Das was crying pathetically because the doctor said that her child is seriously ill. She has a hole in her heart which needs an immediate surgery otherwise may not survive any more. But as the child is so little they cannot do this in their hospital, The Head of the deptt. CTVS referred the parents of that child to AIIMAS at New Delhi. The father of the child Amar Das was a labour and has no such economic condition to go to New Delhi. I myself the PO (NIC) was there at that time and observing that the father and his relatives and friends were running here and there with one group D staff of that hospital. Who was in drunken situation and assuring the child's father and relatives that he has source and can admit her in the hospital. I was sure that he might demand money from the party later. I slowly start conversation with the mother. She says everything about her. I promise her to meet with a health officer and her treatment can be arranged in Kolkata if she meets with us at my office. I at the same time give her my mobile no. and assure that I will help her at my level best.

Two days later she comes at my office. I directly approach Shri Jyoti Babu, the Karmadhyakha of Health, Zilla Parishad office North 24 Parganas. He directly calls the superintendent of Barasat District Govt. Hospital and explains the details and also asked to do prompt action to arrange her admission. The second day the child was checked up at Barasat Hospital and referred to Rabindra Nath Cardiac Hospital, Kolkata. The father of the child admits her at the said hospital and within 7 days her operation was held successfully.

Later a day the mother comes to meet and to say her gratitude's to the whole DCPS team at our office with the child in her lap but this time she was with a smiling face which you may also view.....

South 24 Parganas

Capacity Building :

Capacity building of duty bearers of Juvenile Justice Mechanism is one of the statutory works of DCPS. During 2014 - '15, DCPS, South 24 Parganas 25 capacity building programme on CP issues, legislations to various duty bearers in the district; some of the capacity building programme were conducted in collaboration with some NGOs, Home Dept. etc. The CB programme also aimed to establish to form strategic alliance among various duty bears as stipulated in JJCPC Act, 2000 and as read with 2006 and also a functional liaison among various Govt. Departments, NGOs, CBOs. Apart from that the induction meeting of BLCPC may be construed as a capacity building programme where overviews on CP issues and outline of CP legislations have been discussed. During 2014 – '15, DCPS, South 24 Parganas took a significant role in 12 such meetings.¹

Restoration :

DCPS, South 24 Parganas played a crucial role during transfer of children of South 24 Parganas who were rescued as CNCP from other States of India in accordance with the Standard Operating Procedure framed by Ministry of Women & Child Development (MWCD).

Child Marriage :

Child Marriage is of two types; - 1. Contractual Child Marriage, and, 2. Elopement and marriage. DCPS, South 24 Parganas has been dealing contractual child marriage cases successfully in collaboration with CHILDLINE (key informant) and police through the provision of Rule 82, Central Model Rules, 2007 of JJCPC Act, 2000 and as read with 2006. Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 has also been instrumental to combat against this offence against children. During 2014 - '15, DCPS, South 24 Parganas dealt with 37 contractual child marriage cases successfully through prevention.³

Missing Children :

DCPS, South 24 Parganas provided handholding support in the shape of coordinating among various departments, especially police (Missing Person Bureau & Anti Human Trafficking Unit) to trace out missing/lost/rescued children, lodging FIR, initiating specified cases, filling M form & R form, bringing the cases before CWC and uploading the details of missing children in web portal.

Individual Grievances :

DCPS, South 24 Parganas dealt individual grievances related to children in the shape of coordinating among various departments. DCPS, South 24 Parganas worked as a facilitating agency to address those grievances. During 2014 - '15, DCPS, South 24 Parganas dealt with 17 individual grievances successfully.



Assistance and Monitoring of JJ Homes :

DCPS, South 24 Parganas provided a handholding support to all JJ Homes in its initial phase to facilitate transfer, restoration, escalation of SoC, preparation of ICP, Uploading details of the children to www.trackthemissingchild.gov.in

Sponsorship :

Deinstitutionalization is one of major indicators of effective roll out of ICPS and rehabilitative sponsorship may be considered as instrumental for such deinstitutionalization through conditional cash transfer. During 2014 – '15, processing of 10 cases of sponsorship in favor of 10 children is almost done.⁴

Food monitoring In JJ Homes during the time of visit of DCPS staff :

After the enhancement in allocation for per child in JJ Home by GoI and as a district-response to the model diet plan as postulated by Child Development & Women Development & Social Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal, DCPS, South 24 Parganas introduced Food monitoring in all JJ Homes of South 24 Parganas.⁵

Convergence and coordination :

DCPS, south 24 Parganas initiated –

Intervention for children working in Brick Kilns and children of workers of Brick Kilns :

As majority of the workers are seasonal and result unsafe migration, many of the children are deprived of their rights and basic entitlements. DCPS started working to intervene in this matter. PRI functionaries have been explained regarding this in Sub-divisional CB programme, BDOs have been intimated to submit list of such brick kilns in their concerned blocks. Working in close liaison with Labour Department, Education Department and Health Department is of extreme importance to bring about a successful intervention.

Working with Para Legal Volunteers :

Para Legal Volunteers have been appointed to monitor effective implementation of social legislations including CP legislations in every police station of the district. They need to be equipped with technical knowledge to make use of their portfolios which will lead to effective juvenile justice mechanism. DCPS planned to coordinate with Department of Judiciary and DLSA to impart them intense knowledge on CP issues and legislations.⁶

Good practices

1. IEC Material

- A booklet *Sthanantorer Jana Ajana : (known and unknown facts of Migration)* was printed in BENGALI. The target group is the vulnerable adolescent and youth population of this region. Considering the local demand this booklet has been translated in Hindi and ready to be published for Tea belt region of the District.

- **Fight Against Unsafe Migration From the Tea Garden Areas**

The Commandant of 10th BN SSB at Malbazar, **an active Local NGO** (Dooars Express Mail) that works for prevention and rehabilitation of human trafficking and **The District Child protection unit** will meet in October 2015 to work on the field testing of the proposal received by DCPU from SSB and DEM.

This proposal is an outcome of a survey conducted by DCPU in May-June 2014. The objective was to understand the scope of intervention to fight the growing incidences of unsafe migration from this region.

In response to the findings of the survey a book was developed for sensitization among the vulnerable population and then followed the proposal development joint effort by DCPU, SSB & DEM. As a subsequent development UNICEF has extended its technical advice to move ahead for a pilot project.

2. **Public Hearing –Right to Education Act** was held in Nov 2015 by the West Bengal Commission for Protection of Child Rights (WBSCPCR) and hosted by DCPU, Jalpaiguri. for a cluster of the districts, as desired by the hon'ble Chairperson, WBSCPCR.
3. **Special measures** have been taken by the District Magistrate, Jalpaiguri to address the persistent problem of over crowdedness and long term institutionalization. Case to case follow up has been structured to facilitate educational rehabilitation, SAA-CCI linkage, Sponsorship guided family restoration under the direct supervision of Additional District Magistrate (G).
4. Five Police station have been identified to be promoted as **child friendly police station** in the district. Process to resume soon after Election model code of conduct is over.

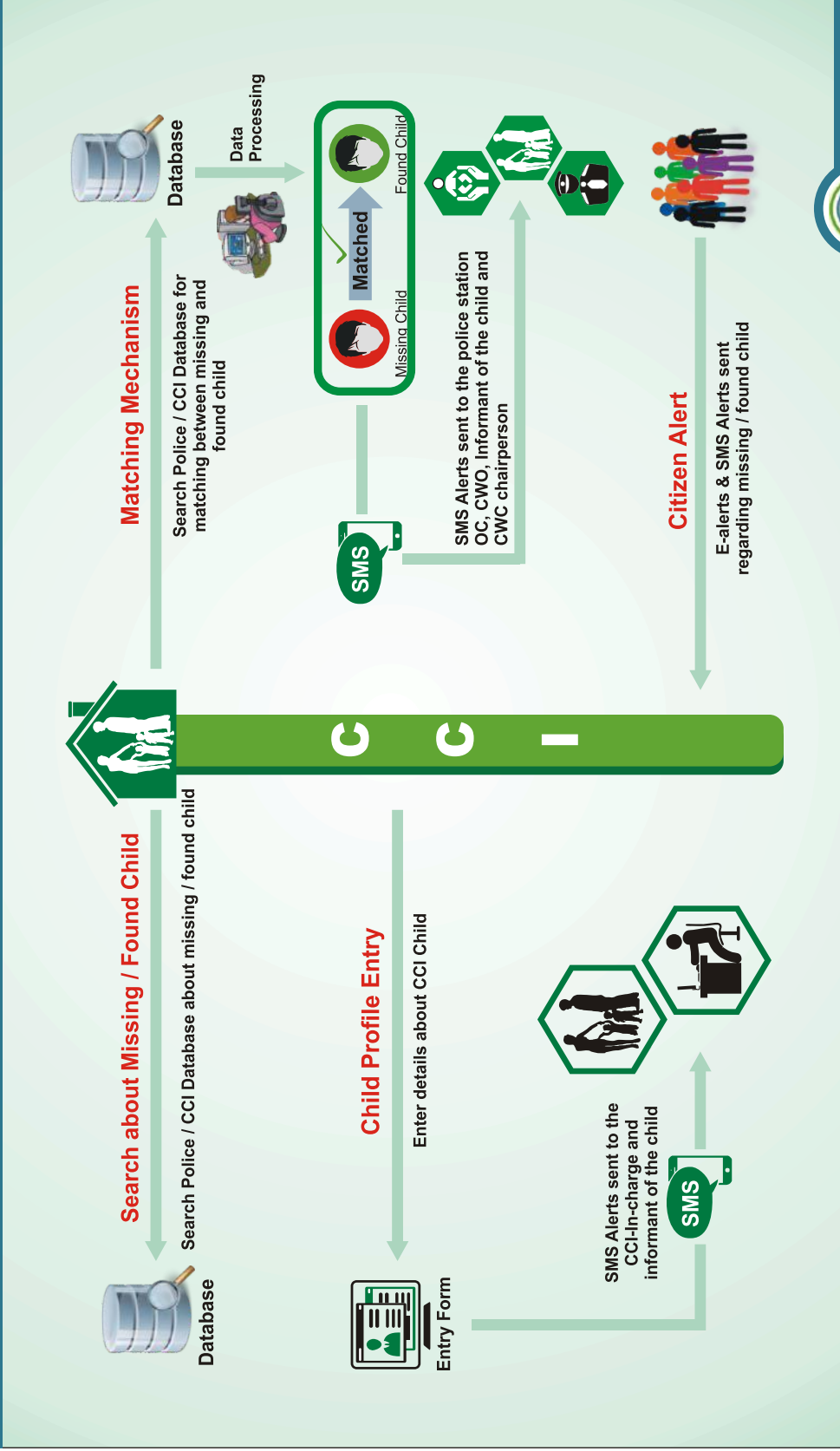

TRACK CHILD

About

The centrally sponsored ICPS Scheme aims at contributing to the improvement of children who are in difficult circumstances. The MWCD entrusted NIC to develop a comprehensive ICT based system to track the 'missing' as well as 'vulnerable children'. After a successful pilot implementation in West Bengal, the system was rolled out nationally during 2011-12. The portal 'TrackChild' holds live data base of 'missing' & 'found' children and tracks the overall progress of the children living in the Child Care Institutions (CCIs).

'TrackChild' portal has been designed and developed adhering to the guidelines provided in the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000 and Model Rules 2007 and the provisions laid down in the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS). One of the tasks entrusted under ICPS to the State Governments is the setting up of a child tracking system which will facilitate data entry and matching of missing and found children, and also enable follow up of the progress of children who are beneficiaries of the Scheme. Thus, proper monitoring and welfare of the children under the Scheme would also be ensured through this portal.

'TrackChild' portal provides an integrated virtual space for all stakeholders & ICPS bodies which includes Central Project Support Unit (CPSU), State Child Protection Society (SCPS) and District Child Protection Units (DCPU), Child Care Institutions (CCIs), Police Stations, Child Welfare Committees (CWCs), Juvenile Justice Boards (JJBs), etc. in the 36 State/UTs. It also provides a networking system amongst all the stakeholders and citizens to facilitate tracking of a "Child in distress". It requires data entry by different stakeholders.

Objectives

- To ensure timely tracking of "Missing Children"
- To ensure repatriation and rehabilitation of the recovered children
- To ensure monitoring of the children in Child Care Institutions (CCIs)
- To set up a framework for participating stakeholders involved in the process

- Maintain and monitor "Individual Child Care Plan" for every CCI Child
- Tracking of every CCI Child
- Online Matches of "Found" children with "Missing" children
- Online Report for "Missing / Found" cases

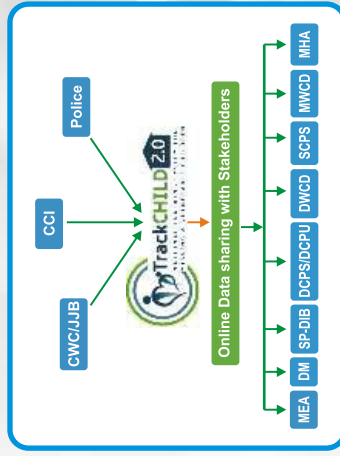

'Trackchild' mobile

The citizen interface of 'TrackChild' system may be accessed through mobile devices. A citizen can access the portal through mobile devices to use 'specialised' light weight interfaces to 'report a missing' / 'report a found' children or to search a missing / found children. A mobile app has also been developed & made available in 'Google Play Store' & 'NICApp Store' for downloading.

The SMS Alert system sends alert messages to pre-defined stakeholders for initiating prompt action at their end for addressing the issue.
